Announcement of Synchrotron Light Research Institute (Public Organization)
Guidelines for Prevention Measure and Surveillance of Coronavirus (2019-nCOV)

Regarding the current outbreak of the Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) emerged from Wuhan, People's Republic of China, with great number of infections and deaths. This airborne illness is reported to be contagious through respiratory system and also direct contact with secretion. Currently, infected patients are reported travelling to Thailand and the World Health Organization (WHO) has urgently declared the outbreak of Coronavirus as a global health emergency.

For disease prevention and control in accordance with the Announcement of Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research and Innovation regarding "Vigilant Measures against the Spread of Coronavirus (2019-nCoV)" dated 25 January 2020, and according to the Decree of Board of SLRI Ref. No. 8/2016 "The Appointment of Chief Executive Officer of Synchrotron Light Research Institute" issued on 1 June 2016, SLRI hereby announces the following prevention measures:

- 1. SLRI staff are recommended to avoid getting exposure to people returning from People's Republic of China for disease prevention.
- 2. SLRI staff with fever or symptoms including coughing, runny nose, having phlegm, sore throat, sneezing, or other respiratory symptoms are recommended to inform their superiors and contact Suranaree University of Technology Hospital for further precaution and medical treatment.
- 3. SLRI staff having plans of traveling to People's Republic of China need to cancel or postpone their trips and perform disease surveillance from time to time.
- 4. Beamtime allocation has been provided for users from People's Republic of China need to be cancelled or postponed until informed otherwise.
- 5. SLRI staff are recommended to avoid travelling to crowded areas, getting exposure to people with suspected or coughing symptoms. Wearing mask and always washing hands with soap or alcoholic cleansing gel are highly recommended.

SLRI will monitor real-time disease surveillance and other collaborations may be required from staff for further prevention.
