## SLRI Announcement on

The One (1) New Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) Infected Case at SLRI

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Pursuant to the Decree of the Board of SLRI, Ref. No. 7/2020, on "Appointment of Director of Synchrotron Light Research Institute" issued on 29 May 2020, SLRI hereby announces that there are 4 CORONA Virus 2019 (COVID-19) infected cases at SLRI. Information is as follows:

- 1. On Thursday, 24 March 2022, the infected **case No. 30** was found. The case is a female SLRI officer, aged 49 working at BL 4.1, Research Facility Department.
- Thursday, 23 March 2022 was the last day she worked at SLRI before having home isolation.
- She had sore throat and had self-ATK test at residence on Wednesday, 23 March 2022 and found positive result.
- The RT-PCR test done at SUT Hospital on Thursday, 24 March 2022 was found positive.
- She already received 4 doses of vaccination (Sinovac, Sinovac, AstraZeneca and Pfizer, respectively).
- She is now having home isolation at her residence.
- There are 2 high risk contacts found in her case.
- 2. All high risk contacts need to receive COVID-19 screening test at a hospital or have home isolation, and have the first ATK test on day  $5^{th}$  or  $6^{th}$  after having the latest close contact with the infected case. Then, they need to have the second ATK test on day  $10^{th}$  after having the latest close contact with the infected case and need to notice for their own symptom every day. In case of any infectious symptom found, receiving a screening test at a hospital is required.

If any other SLRI colleague suspects of having COVID-19 infection, or has close contact with an infected case, an informing to a superior is needed to request for working from home for a period of 5-7 days from the latest contact with an infected case. The colleague also needs to receive a screening test with ATK or RT-PCR, and report the test result to Safety Division officer.

3. The areas related to the infected case and nearby areas were already cleaned for disinfection. Those areas are prohibited for use until 27 March 2022.



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All SLRI colleagues are requested to strictly take care of their own personal health with good

sanitation and perform following the COVID-19 controlling measures issued by SLRI and by the Center
